

Teen Camp 2019 FAQ & Answers

Question	Answer
Why the switch to Camp Berea?	China Lake's campground rental cost has increased \$250/day from last year's cost, and next summer will increase another \$250/day. We are unable to cover that increase without doubling the cost of camp. The NYI Council found a campground with better amenities and more activity options on site for a lower price.
Why did the cost increase?	We have not increased the price of camp for several years despite our costs going up. Camp Berea is cheaper than China Lake, but still more expensive than what we had been paying.
Where is Camp Berea located?	37 Cedarbrook Way Lyman, ME 04002 25 minutes from Saco Exit on I-95
Who will be cooking the meals?	Camp Berea provides plentiful buffet-style meals and the coffee bar with hot drinks is open 24/7.
Will they accommodate those with food allergies?	Yes, please note these allergies on your registration form.
What is there to do during free time?	Multiple gaga ball pits and several large field spaces are available for our use. Located beneath the Dining Hall, the Rec Room serves as a versatile area for either a meeting space or a game room. The space is equipped with a foosball table, ping pong, tailgate toss, and carpetball.
Is there a place to go swimming?	YES! We will be swimming each day in Bunganot Pond. Activities such as tubing, waterskiing, kayaking, and canoeing will be available throughout the week.

Will there be a campfire?	YES! There are multiple firepits and we will be making a plan for everyone to get a turn to have a campfire (weather permitting).
Should I bring spending money?	YES! There will be a Snack Shack and t-shirts available for sale.
Will we have an ENC team this summer?	YES! We'll actually have both a Camp Team and an acoustic Worship Team. Mark Ganglefinger will also be joining us for evening worship.
Are there any downsides of this campground?	There is no gym space at Camp Berea.
But it's so far away!	We are working on getting shuttles to pick up campers all along Route 95 to ease that burden.
Are we combining with the New England District?	No. That option was explored, but decided against.
